Supply List and Fee

Class fee of \$15 will cover extensive handouts, surface design and construction supplies, and use of basic tools.

- Sewing machine in good working order. Pack your instruction booklet (and your plug -- don't laugh; it's happened!).
- Extra needles and bobbins
- Sewing scissors
- Paper scissors
- Rotary cutter and suitcase-sized mat
- Straight pins
- Threads to match or blend with fabrics you've chosen
- Threads to use for surface design on quilt top (hand or machine thread)
- #2 pencil, sharpener, and eraser
- Inexpensive sketch book or sheets of unlined white paper
- Tracing paper
- Clear tape and masking tape
- Glue stick
- Iron and towel or portable ironing board
- Multi-plug extension cord with surge protection
- Table-top light
- Sheet to cover your work at night
- Fabric adhesive: At least one yard. (I prefer Steam a Seam 2, but if you have a favorite, bring that)
- Batting: keep in mind that we'll be working small
- White flannel or needlepunched white batting to cover the provided foam core design board
- Fabric: **Bring an assortment of colors and values.** Amounts may vary from fat quarters to one yard pieces. It is essential to pack a variety of colors and to vary the saturation of those colors. This means some colors need to be clear, pure, and intense, and others should be muddied, others should be very light, some should be very dark. I will supply solid black and solid white fabric for class exercises. As always in a design class, this is the hardest item on the supply list. Bring as much fabric as your upper body strength and suitcases allow. You will be happier. This is one of the times more is better.
- Sense of humor, willingness to take design risks. These are not optional.

Optional:

- Reducing glass, binoculars, digital camera or other tool for viewing your work from a distance
- Ideas/images for quilts you'd like to start in class once we've finished the design exercises
- Chocolate, for medicinal purposes

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
