Whether you're a new or seasoned quiltmaker, discover how freezer-paper piecing can transform your inspiration into remarkable works of art.

We'll discover faceted vistas within gemstone images; create sparkle with value contrast and color; evaluate fabrics' impact on design; create a coded pattern; and experiment with quilting & finishing techniques. At weeks end, you'll have created a gorgeous, faceted mini-quilt.

This is not foundation paper piecing! This is traditional piecing using freezer paper as templates. I'll provide images of a variety of gems, but students are also welcome to bring enlarged color images of personal jewelry to use as inspiration.

Fabric: **Basic sewing supplies:** ☐ Pins and/or clips (such as Wonder Clips) to hold fabric ■ The fabrics best suited to this project include commercially-produced solids and ombres, hand-dyed fabrics, together and hand-painted fabric. ☐ Optional: If you prefer to use fabric glue instead of pins, please bring!
